CNN Analyst and Best-Selling Author Jeffrey Toobin at the Carpenter Center
Toobin Brings Timely Insights on the Supreme Court and US Politics to Wit & Wisdom Series

LONG BEACH, California —Senior legal analyst for CNN and staff writer for *The New Yorker* Jeffrey Toobin brings an evening of unbiased, analytic—and often very funny—insight on American law, politics, and media to the Carpenter Performing Arts Center, located on the campus of Cal State Long Beach, on Saturday, January 27, 2018 at 8 pm.

Last month, Toobin announced that he is currently working on a book that will cover special counsel Robert Mueller’s investigation into the alleged Russian interference with the 2016 Presidential Election. DoubleDay editor in chief Bill Thomas said of Toobin’s announcement, “This is the book that Jeff Toobin was born to write.” Though it’s his books and CNN appearances that Toobin is known for, he brings the same keen understanding of American law and uncanny instinct for cultural resonance to live audiences in a moment where it is rare to talk about news in more than just thirty second soundbites. *An Evening with Jeffrey Toobin* is a chance to engage in discourse on some of the most provocative and important events of our time in a stimulating evening of wit and wisdom.

Jeffrey Toobin started his career as a New York lawyer serving as an assistant U.S. attorney; now he is a widely-recognized Emmy Award-winning journalist and *New York Times* bestselling author. His 2016 book, *American Heiress: The Wild Saga of the Kidnapping, Crimes, and Trial of Patty Hearst* was hailed by the *New York Times* as “terrifically engrossing,” and his 1996 book *The Run of His Life: The People vs. O. J. Simpson* was adapted into a 10 part mini-series by the FX Network in 2016 starring Cuba Gooding Jr.
